How Donnaha got its name:

YADKIN VALLEY PILOT

Thursday, July 6, 1916
East Bend, Yadkin County, N. C.
By Pleasant H. Poindexter,
Donnaha, N. C., July 24, 1907

The first Poindexters in North Carolina were reared near Old Richmond, Surry County, in the bend of the Yadkin River, by Thomas and Elizabeth Poindexter.

The grandfather of Thomas Poindexter was a French Protestant, whose adherence to his religious principles compelled Page 2 him to leave his native land and seek shelter 2008

under papal protection in the island of Great Britain. At this time he was the head of a large family.

The father of Thomas, who was also named Thomas, emigrated to Virginia, Louisa County. I think also the young lady who afterward became his wife emigrated from England to Virginia. It is said that from these descended all the Poindexters known in America.

They reared a large family in Louisa County, Virginia. John, who was a brother of the younger Thomas, was a distinguished Baptist preacher in Louisa and adjoining counties. For many years he was clerk of Louisa County, and filled this position until his death, which occurred in the latter part of the year 1819.

The younger Thomas and his wife, Elizabeth, entered or purchased in about 1760, a section of land, 140 acres, known as Bailey's Bottoms in the bend of the Yadkin River.

Tradition says that Thomas Poindexter's wife's (Elizabeth) maiden name was Pledge, and that her mother (Bettie) was the daughter of an Indian Chief of the Cherokee nation; Bettie Pledge's maiden name was Donahoo.

Thomas Poindexter died January 1, 1807, leaving a widow and twelve children. His wife, Elizabeth, died February 9, 1816. She was buried five-eights of a mile from Donnaha, N. C., on the top of a steep hill in plain view of Donnaha. Her great grandson, the late Dr. Samuel Martin, of

Winston - Salem, named the village, which is opposite her grave, Donahoo, in honor of Elizabeth Poindexter's grandfather, we think, but the name was spelled incorrectly and became Donnaha.



ECU Spainhour Alumni Helps Make Life in Africa Better **Through Staff of Hope**

Excerpt from a recent article published in "EAST" ECUthe Alumni Spotlight Magazine

It all started in August 2000 when Jeff Spainhour ('94 alumni) was a student at Fuller Theological Seminary. Jeff asked another student, Moses Pulei, about conditions in his homeland of Kenya. After learning about the poverty there, Spainhour felt moved to do something. He told other seminarians about the needs of the Kenyan people. Soon, a group formed that raised enough money to purchase and ship a drill to Kenya so people could bore wells for safe drinking water.

In August 2001, Spainhour and Pulei formalized their efforts by co-founding Staff of Hope, a nonprofit focused on serving

the people of Kenya and Tanzania. Partnering with churches donors, the group so far has drilled 11 wells, each serving 350 families. The group also built Oloile Secondary School Kimani, Kenya which serves more than 200 students. They also constructed a needed dam and promoted micro enterprises to bring sustainable jobs to the community. In neighboring Tanzania, Staff of Hope is sponsoring two girls to go to college.

When he isn't in Africa, which he is about six or eight weeks every year, Spainhour is an associate pastor at Triangle Presbyterian Church in Raleigh.


